SACS Annual Exhibition, Ayscoughfee Hall, 2-30 May



We had an excellent display of paintings from 18 members. This year the venue had a photo viewer on which we displayed Society events, challenges and demonstrators from the past few years. 'Meet the Artist' on 11th May at Ayscoughfee proved very popular with over 80 people coming into the Geest Gallery to view our exhibition and talk

to the artists. Also popular were the postcards from our Paint a Pig challenge - from the comments we heard everyone found them very entertaining. 8 paintings were sold. There were a lot of votes for the People's Choice Award, spread across most of the paintings. It was won by Lorraine Swepson with her acrylic ink painting 'Sunset'.



Recent Exhibitions and Challenges

Spring Flower painting challenge: The paintings were on display at the April meeting and at the Spring Flower & Daffodil Show at Springfields Event Centre. There was a lot of interest in the exhibition with several cards and paintings sold. The voting from both members and the public gave 1st place to Clare Ratcliffe with 'Iris & Daffs'. In 2nd place was Wyn Cocks with 'Hellebores & miniature daffs'. The winner of the raffle prize, a painting by Jerome Hunt, donated it back to the society to raffle again.

Pinchbeck Church Art Exhibition: On for 10 days in April/May this again proved a popular venue with twelve paintings sold during the Flower Festival, mostly by Wyn!

Tulipfest 4th-6th May: The winner of our tulip painting competition, sponsored by Springfields Horticultural Society, was Claire Baker with 'The Wonders of the Fields' - a delightful painting of Tulips with a Harvest Mouse. Not only did she get First from the judges, Claire also got the Public Vote. In second place was Norma Elsey with 'The Tulip Fields of South Holland'. The winner of the raffle of Jerome Hunt's 'Tulip Still Life' was delighted with his win and said it would take pride of place over their fireplace. Thanks to Jerome for donating the painting - it has raised £90 for the society.

Craft Shows by Maggie Goodsell

Makit L,Q & N: A new venue for the show this year. Previously held at Peterborough Showground it moved to the Kingsgate Conference Centre. Not, in my opinion, a good move. There were plenty of supplies to be had but it looked more like a table top sale than a show and the advertised needlecraft exhibitions didn't live up to previous shows - I won't go again. The only thing that caught my eye was a panel sewn by young quilters aged 9-14 entitled Magical Adventures. Each child had created a character independently and they then had to build a story around them.

Grosvenor Quilt Show: This has proved so popular that they now hold both a Spring and an Autumn show at the Springfields Event Centre. Lots of excellent stands to temp you to spend - I succumbed again and bought yet more material to add to my already overflowing stash. Plenty to look at - as well as all the finished crafts on display on the retail stands there were quilts, large and small, from a range of talented crafters. Whilst being impressed by the skills needed to create the large quilts, I am always drawn to the smaller wall hanging types. This year didn't disappoint as there was an excellent display of smaller ones including over 20 by the Lincolnshire Quilters to celebrate the achievements of Sir Joseph Banks.





Art In Eastbourne by Lorraine Swepson

A recent visit to Eastbourne led Veronica and I to the Towner Contemporary Art Museum. The museum moved in 2009 to a new building which is built mainly of concrete and was designed to reflect the chalk cliffs of the Eastbourne Downs.

It boast in excess of 4,000 works of art by historic, modern and contemporary artists including Pablo Picasso, Henry Moore, Vanessa Bell and Lawrence Alma-Tadema. Many of these works are not on view but can be accessed by prior appointment or during special tours.

The day of our visit the work of Ravilious was being shown. It was interesting to see the subtle changes in his work over the years.

Contemporary work was also being shown. While I don't claim to understand everything I saw, the installations were still worth seeing.

We followed this by going to the Nigel Greaves Gallery based on Compton Street. This was more to my taste. Along with a few watercolours, there were many interesting and vibrant paintings by Nigel. He welcomed us into his gallery and explained how he mixed his own paint using pigments and some of the techniques he uses. The subjects were varied and well executed, Nigel sells his work both at home and abroad. We found him to be very interesting and welcoming, well worth the visit.
